



As children experience the power of play, they become artists, engineers, makers, designers, builders, and scientists ready to take on the world!

Maria Montessori said, "Children learn best by doing." From parent surveys at events, approximately 80% list "opportunities/places to go" as the top barrier to participating in educational play. Thanks to many community partners, we have continued to expand opportunities for children to learn through collaborative play in South Central Idaho.

This year, almost 10,000 children and their adults participated in Family STEAM Nights (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math) and afterschool events in Twin Falls, Kimberly, Filer, Buhl, Hagerman, Wendell, Jerome, Shoshone, Richfield, Burley, Malta, Rupert, Declo, Paul, Oakley and even Mountain Home!

It was a busy summer! Grant funds provided for the purchase of a pre-owned cargo van enabling us to reach more children in rural areas. We collaborated with public libraries and summer lunch programs and held pop-up events where children made instruments, rockets, flashlights or emergency shelters. They loved tinkering and creating something new with everyday items that made noise or light, flew in the air, or protected them from rain! It was inspiring to see their faces light up when things finally worked for them, and they got to take their creations home.

At the Wendell Public Library, one girl made four different instruments as she kept coming up with new ideas. Parents loved the open-ended projects and that children could get messy! We also participated in summer camps and other community events, including our very own "Day of Play" at 2nd South Market and the Annular Solar Eclipse event.

Since launching in 2019, 24,825 children and their adults have played at CMMV On the Go! events!
